
19 FACTS ABOUT NEW-YORK


The first Europeans to colonize the island were the Dutch.


They settled in Manhattan in 1624 and started trading fur.

MANHATTAN = an Indian name "MANAHTIN" meaning " island of the hills"









In 1664, the British captured New Amsterdam from the Dutch and changed its name to New York, in honour of the Duke of York, the English King's brother.







FACT 9

New York remained English until 1783 when the Americans won the Revolutionary war against England. That year they made New York the first capital city of the USA.

The American Revolutionary War 1775-1783 also known as the American War of Independence, was a war between Great Britain and its Thirteen Colonies (allied with France) which declared independence as the United States of America.

For many years, millions of immigrants came from Europe and Asia to settle in New York.


They were looking for religious or political freedom and a better life.

Many TV series and films are shot in Manhattan , so the skyline is a familiar sight to people all over the world .
















TV series shot in New York Manhattan

go West-East






There are so many skyscrapers in New York!

During the first half of the 20th century, many architects competed to build the best and tallest buildings ever the "Skyscraper Race" started.

As the population of New York City increased in the 20th century, tall buildings and then skyscrapers staeted to dominate the skyline.

In turn, the Empire State Building, The Chrysler Building and the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center were listed as the tallest buildings in the world.

Today, the "Freedom Tower" is the tallest tower on the New York skyline at 541m.

THE EMPIRE STATE BUILDING: Until 1973, it was the tallest building in the world. With the radio mast, it is 443m high. There are 73 elevators and not one that goes to the top. You have to change twice to reach the 102nd floor.

102nd floor deck . On a clear day you can see up to 128km away.

There is an open terrace on the 86th floor.

RUN-UP RACE: An annual run-up race is held in February from the lobby to the 86th floor, 1.575 steps!! In 2014 there were 157 participants. The male winner was a Norwegian who went up in 10'06". The female winner was an Australian who won the race for the fifth time in 11'57".

THE EMPIRE STATE BUILDING: It has appeared more than 95 times in movies . The most famous are KINGKONG, AN AFFAIR TO REMEMBER and SLEEPLESS IN SEATTLE.

The Empire State Building is a 102 storey skyscraper located on Fifth Avenue.

It measures 381m (443 with its antenna spine)
It was inaugurated in 1931.

It was designed in an Art Deco style

It has long been the tallest skyscraper in the world



If you want to have a panoramic view of New York, go to the Empire State Building: 86th floor observation desk or the 102nd floor observation desk.









Central Park is a huge park located in the middle of Manhattan skyscrapers.

It was created in 1873.

It is the largest park in New York City and it's known as "The

Lungs of the City"











In Central Park , there are some artificial lakes and a golf ground .

Newyorkers can ice-skate , experience pedicab tours or horse-drawn rides , roller-skate , cycle , bird-watch . They can also attend concerts , play sports or just go for a walk.

It's the perfect place for Newyorkers to relax.

The main attraction in Central Park is the zoo.

You can see parrots, polar bears, pinguins,
snow leopards or tortoises.





Liberty Island is a small inhabited island near Manhattan.

On the island there is one of the most important

American monument:

The Statue of Liberty.

The Statue of Liberty was a gift from France.

It was offered to the USA in 1886 as a sign of friendship between the two countries.

The Statue of Liberty is also known as "Lady

Liberty" but its full name is "The Statue of Liberty Enlightening the World"

"Lady Liberty" is holding a torch in its right hand and a tablet in its left hand reading the date July 4th 1776 which is the date of the signing of

the Declaration of Independence.









The Statue of Liberty

THE STATUE: It is in copper and its internal iron support was designed by Gustave Eiffel.

THE TORCH: Miss Liberty's arm is 13 metres long and holds the torch of liberty which lights the world. It used to serve as a lighthouse.

THE CROWN: The seven points on the crown symbolize liberty on the seven continents.

THE WINDOWS: You can climb to the top of the statue to admire the view from its 25 windows which represent the Earth's 25 gemstones.

THE TABLET: It reads July 4th 1776. That was the day the Americans declared their independence from England.

THE STATUE'S DRESS: It looks like the costume of an ancient Greek woman. Ancient Greece was the birthplace of democracy. So her dress symbolizes democracy.

THE STATUE'S FEET: You can see broken shackles (= chains) by Miss Liberty's feet. They symbolize the escape from tyranny and oppression.


THE PEDESTAL: It is in the shape of a star.

The STATUE OF LIBERTY is the most emblematic landmark of New York City. It was a gift of friendship from the people of France to the people of the United States in 1886 to celebrate the hundredth anniversary of American Independence.

From the end of the 19th century to the 1930s, millions of immigrants coming from all over Europe arrived in New York by boat. The first thing they saw was the Statue of Liberty: the universally recognized symbol of freedom and democracy.



Emma Lazarus (1849–1887) was an American poet who was commissioned to write a poem to help raise funds for the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty. She initially declined and then wrote a sonnet commemorating the plight of immigrants. Lines from that 1883 sonnet, "The New Colossus," were engraved on the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty in 1903.

There are lots of luxury shops.






HARLEM is the center of Black American culture with famous jazz clubs and gospels choirs as well as Hispanic communities.
