



- › always hides under the bed


Example





Le présent simple et l'expression de la fréquence

→ Tu utilises les adverbes de fréquence et le présent simple pour dire si tu fais une action toujours (**always**), habituellement (**usually**), souvent (**often**), parfois (**sometimes**), ou jamais (**never**).



L'adverbe de fréquence se place toujours **avant** le verbe.
Mais il se place **après** l'auxiliaire **be**.

Forme affirmative	Forme négative	Forme interrogative
Chester is always energetic.	My cat doesn't often eat carrots.	How often do you feed her?
